We are pleased to announce that as of November 1, 2020 we are getting closer to our budgeted goal of \$160,000-\$170,000. We have received, to-date, 43 pledge cards totaling \$113,199 for the General Fund, \$11,211 for the Capital Fund, \$9,288 for the Parking lot and \$2,183 for Per Capita. Last year we received a total of 62 pledge cards so we have a ways to go. We are still accepting pledge cards and are hopeful that we will get close to meeting our goal. Anyone who has misplaced or lost their pledge can pick one up at the church office, in the narthex or call the office and another one can be mailed to you.

We have been challenged this year by the pandemic but have been blessed by the response from the congregation.
