Mourning Our Losses, Healing Our Wounds

Today was a rare 80 degree day in April, blue skies and no showers. I spent my morning with the staff and saints at White Oaks Assisted Living in Lawton, leading a memorial service for a year plus' worth of lives waiting to be mourned, forty-four departed residents, including many who died from Covid-19.

With the help of heart-felt music offered by Kelsey and Marissa (the activities directors who have been Zooming me into the facility for bi-monthly Bible study) we sought comfort in the words of Psalm 103: *as a father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion on those who fear him; for he knows how we are formed, he remembers that we are dust.* Names were prayed from our hearts, and written on stones laid at the base of a memorial tree.

My afternoon was spent indoors, on a Zoom call with pastors and members of our Presbytery to lay the groundwork for some important and difficult conversations. At the 2020 General Assembly, our denomination drafted a "Statement on the Sin of Racism," which churches are now being asked to study, and which our Presbytery will vote on in June. The Statement names the brokenness that has existed for far too long, and calls for churches and us individually as members to take specific actions to further the work of healing, including: individual and corporate confession and repentance, educating ourselves by listening and responding to the voices of the oppressed, and actively engaging in initiatives aimed at dismantling the sin of racism, such as the PC (USA'S) *Matthew 25* initiative, which has led many churches already Healer of our every ill, light of each tomorrow, give us peace beyond our fear, and hope beyond our sorrow. – Marty Haugen

Church Internet Upgraded for Speed and Security

Separate and faster live streaming and recording of worship services has also been installed.



You'll be asked to sign an agreement about using the church internet and given one-day access only, good til 10 pm. A new login is required every day for security purposes.

Staff and live streaming will be separate from the guest access from now on to protect the bandwidth as well as the security of church information.




The decision of when and how belongs to Session but they rely on input from the Worship, Administration, and Building and Grounds commissions.
