Spring is arriving and Easter is almost here, but before we get to resurrection, we need to journey to Jerusalem, to the cross. That's what Lent is all about — journeying to the cross.

Now, as we eagerly await more sunshine, warmer weather, and the budding and blossoming of plants — new birth — we will also experience a number of gray days which match the spiritual journey of Lent. During Lent and Holy Week we are called to recognize our humanity, our brokenness, and our need and yearning for a deeper relationship with something bigger than ourselves: the divine spirit of God. Yet on this spiritual journey, we also get a foretaste of the brilliance of God's light and hope for the future in knowing that resurrection is coming as we get glimpses of the Spirit at work.

One glimpse of the Spirit's movement in an important way has been in working towards a partnership or "yoked" relationship in my Interim/Transitional Pastor position with First Presbyterian Church of Decatur. As we faced various obstacles and financial challenges at our church, First Presbyterian of Decatur's pastor resigned and they began to look at creative ways for someone to serve with them during their Interim time. Voila, a new possibility was born!

With Session's support, I first met with three members of Decatur's Session in early February to explore this idea. I brought back some possibilities to our February Session meeting where we decided to move forward in exploring options. We had two joint meetings with Elders representing both churches on February 28 and then on March 14. Along with myself, our Elders in these discussions have been Bill Buhl, Joan Pohl, Andy Thorburn, Eleda Zygadlo; from Decatur: Judy Kish, Marcia Sikkema, and David Vliet. Our Presbytery Committee on Ministry representative Nick Pratt and for Decatur, Rev. Jerry Duggins have been involved along with input from our Executive Presbyter Rev. Fran Lane-Lawrence.

Almost immediately we all realized that this yoked venture brings more opportunities than challenges to better live into our Christian call, although there will be challenges too. In today's changing culture doing shared ministry makes sense in so many ways beyond just financial concerns because it opens up our presence of representing Christ to more people in our communities and in God's world.

In summary, our "yoked" relationship with First Presbyterian Church of Decatur will be based on a 40-hour work week, knowing at times the pastorate requires more hours. In theory, it will involve me working 25% (10 hrs) of my time with Decatur and 75% (30 hrs) with Paw Paw. My salary will also be divided in this manner between the two churches. Realistically my hours will vary between churches on certain weeks depending on what is needed in each congregation. To monitor this, we'll have representatives from both churches meet every other month to review how things are going.

How will this work? First Decatur will be joining us for Easter Sunday for 10am worship with fellowship following. Then beginning on Sunday, April 16, I will preach in Decatur at 9:00am and at Paw Paw at 11:00am. Paw Paw has the 11am time to allow for choir rehearsal before the service.

The current needs of the two churches as expressed in our meetings are:

First Decatur (1/4th time)

- Sunday Worship Leadership/Preaching at 9:00am, greetings after worship
- Moderate the Session and work with Elders
- Visitation to hospitalized members
- Office presence one afternoon a week (four hours) and a possible Bible Study

First Paw Paw (3/4th time)

- Sunday Worship Leadership/Preaching at 11:00am, presence at Fellowship time
- Moderate the Session and work with Elders' leadership
- Continued work with Session to implement the recommendations of the Transition Team and Session per the Presbytery Administrative Commission.
- Head of Staff
- Visitation to hospitalized members
- · Office time and availability by email, phone, and texting
- Attendance at committee meetings when possible

Again, this is a synopsis, but it gives you an idea of how my time will be spent. This will require both churches stepping up in various areas like congregational visits and Committee leadership by Elders and members, but that's also a Biblical pattern found throughout the Scripture, especially as the early church grew in the book of Acts and throughout the New Testament. And I think that is exciting to recognize as we move forward with the Risen Christ as our guide.

Sunday Worship on April 16 will be at 11:00 am. On Sunday April 16, we begin our yoked relationship with First Presbyterian Church of Decatur with our new service time of 11:00 am.



Additionally, we look forward to other shared worship times like fifth Sundays or other special occasions. Some other options will be joint Fellowship, Study, and Mission endeavors. During this transition time, this is a wonderful opportunity to try something new, and if it works, we can move forward together in yoked ministries or revert back to what we had before. If we do continue to move forward as yoked congregations, this would financially open both churches up to a larger pool of more experienced pastor candidates. All said, our Sessions are excited to try this new opportunity.

Our goal is to keep communication open and to be transparent in this yoked ministry. So if you have any questions, ideas, thoughts, please do not hesitate to talk with me or one of our current active Elders. Our Sessions and the representative team are working hard to look at the benefits, possibilities, and challenges, yet we also recognize you may see something that we don't.

On Easter Sunday we will celebrate Christ's resurrection and victory over sin and death; we will move forward as Resurrection People, risen anew with Christ into new ways and ministries. May it be so, and thanks be to God!
