Dear Friends in Christ,

A few weeks ago, I attended my Uncle Phil's memorial service in Grand Rapids. He was my mom's brother and the last of four siblings to complete his baptism. Now a generational mantle has been passed to myself, my brother, and cousins. Many of you are familiar with this shifting of generations too. It causes one to pause and think about our purpose and meaning in life and community.

Phil Holtrop was a philosopher, pastor, writer, and religious professor for many years. To no one's surprise, on the back of the memorial bulletin, he left us some of his thoughts about life and faith in his 89th year as he knew his time here was limited.

Now I'm sharing it with you. Why? Because I think it speaks to us in this time and place as we try to discern how to live out our lives within various shifting cultures and values. It's a bit heavy, but stay with it ... I believe it challenges us in good ways.

A Thankful Conclusion, Opportunity, and Invitation by Rev. Dr. Phil Holtrop

The power of grace is not only God's actions and initiatives in our lives — expected or

unexpected. It is also our God-given ability to respond (our response-ability) in each moment. Therefore, it is finally not Christian to separate God's sovereignty and human responsibility, or to see them in conflict. Our "responsibly" is *our* own power because of the power of *God in us*. As "image-bearers," we are most *ourselves*, most free, as we image or reflect God, or "work out the salvation" he "works in" us. Our lifelong task and opportunity, as Christians, is to "seek his kingdom" with that power that he gives. The rewards can be amazing.

God takes the initiative, and if we "boast" (Paul's language here) it is only in the power of the death and resurrection of Christ. In him, we are enabled to die to ourselves, and to live to and for God and others. That is what it means to "seek the Kingdom." In Christ we seek the reconciliation and restoration of all culture, all people, and do not seek "winning arguments" or getting glory or power for ourselves. We "build up" others, to help them wherever and whenever we can; we never "put them down." In the process, we "praise God from whom all blessings flow." We never live for our own pleasure, our vacation, our nice home, our money. We "belong to God" – not ourselves, in every moment. In every way, we seek his Kingdom on earth as it is in heaven. In dying to ourselves, we live most fully. To God be the glory.



Phil uses powerful, "reformed/presbyterian" language to bring home that we are not our own, but belong to God. And he emphasizes that even when we're enjoying life to its fullest and the various pleasures of life, we do so in the light of our identity in God in all things. So, as we enjoy our wonderful Michigan summer, the harvest of our land and gardens, our vacations in God's world, getting together with various friends and relatives, may we do so realizing that we belong to God and that we are called in our lives, in all things, to reflect God's love and glory in the way of Jesus the Christ.

Psalm 103: 1-2 guides us in this way of life: Praise the Lord, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless his holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and do not forget all his benefits ...

- Bill Welling, Chair of Building & Grounds.


We also give thanks to Steve McCloskey who has agreed to come on as our new Church Treasurer!


