Greetings Friends in Christ,

We're now at a point in my interim/transitional ministry with you where we will begin work on our Church's Mission Self-Study. This is an important process that needs to be completed before a Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC) can be formed. The PNC will then begin work on searching and selecting an installed pastor. With our new partnership with First Presbyterian of Decatur, we will also be discerning how we move forward with the probability of calling an installed pastor to serve both congregations.

Interim/Transitional ministry has found that having a Transition Team facilitate the Self-Study works better than having the PNC do this process; this way when a PNC is formed, they can directly begin work on the process of calling a pastor and avoid burn-out.

A Transition Team with Elders from 1st Pres Decatur and Paw Paw has been formed and approved by both Sessions to help us navigate this transitional time and Congregation Mission Self-Study. The members are: Judy Kish, David Vliek, and Marcia Sikkema from Decatur, and Joan Pohl, Tom Shoemaker, and Andy Thorburn from Paw Paw.

Our goal is to have a series of Focus Groups completed before Advent, to finish the Mission Self-Study in the winter-late Spring, and if all goes well, to have a PNC formed in the Spring of 2024.

Focus Groups: One of the steps in moving toward an installed pastor will be important Focus Groups for each congregation. So please, try to attend one of the four being offered for Paw Paw. During these meeting times you will be given the opportunity to share important information to help us focus on our future and eventually form a Pastor Nominating Committee to call an installed pastor. We'll spend some time reviewing important aspects of our congregation and spiritual life, and then transition into future hopes and dreams. Rather than doing another church survey, we want to spend time with you getting direct input from you.

A model of Interim/Transitional Ministry now focuses on five "Focus Points" as we work together to prepare for an installed pastor. They are as follows:

- Heritage: what is your history, what has worked, what not so much.
- **Mission**: what is God calling you to do in this time and place and in the future.

• Leadership: what is needed, what needs to change? We will review and establish best practices so when an installed pastor is called, they can enter a healthier system.

• **Connections**: the PCUSA is a connectional church; we'll explore this together.

• **Future:** how is God calling this congregation to move forward? What needs to be left behind and how can we be open to new possibilities and ways of doing "church" in order to best serve God and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Dr. Rev David Sawyer, an expert of church leadership and conflict, writes: "According to this model, the church organization will focus on each of these focus points in their own unique ways. The transitional leader's role is to coach, guide, or encourage the outcomes as they emerge. This is not a linear process, but it is important to be aware and address these focus points, realizing some will require more attention than others."

Our goal is for Session, the Transition Team, and myself to communicate and be transparent in what we are doing and how we are moving forward with frequent updates.
