WHAT SESSION WANTS YOU TO KNOW

After taking the usual break for the month of July, Session met August 18 to review summer business and plan for fall. Here are the highlights:

WORSHIP PLANS: Session continues to review the recommendations of our Presbytery Leadership and current data about the COVID infection rate in our area, and will continue to make decisions about resuming in-person worship and other activities in our church building based on that information. As of now, we will refrain from holding in-person worship in our sanctuary for the next several weeks, but we will have some opportunities to gather outdoors on September 6 and 20. Please call the church to reserve your place as seating will be socially distanced and limited.

PC(USA) WEEK OF ACTION: Session members shared openly a variety of views and feelings about the issue of racism, the Black Lives Matter movement, and the PC USA's week of action. All observed and agreed that we need to find ways to listen to one another and deepen our relationships with one another and Christ as we work through these challenging issues.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As of July 31, income to the church's General Fund checking account was \$97,983. A gift of stock currently valued at approximately \$9,000 is also held in an investment account and will be deposited into our General Fund checking later this year, all of which brings our total income to date to \$106,983. Expenses year to date are \$101,003 resulting in a surplus of \$5,980 as of July 31, 2020.

Thanks to all for keeping your pledges up to date - as of July 31, pledged giving was under by just \$1,791, based on the increased pledged giving amount of \$152,281 that resulted from our Close the Gap cam-

paign. Since almost all households are current on their pledges, we will NOT be sending out mid-year giving statements. STEWARDSHIP 2021

The last time you heard from the Stewardship Commission was March 1, 2020 at the annual meeting. Dave Nielsen and Mary Ellen Smith gave you an update on the financial situation of our budget. We shared with you a deficit of \$25,000.00 and ask those of you who cold to help us bridge that gap by rethinking your pledged giving. Many of you answered that call and we feel blessed that you did.

We no find ourselves in the middle of a pandemic and headed into another stewardship campaign. Tiffany, Sue, our custodian Monica, musicians, sound and video technicians and many dedicated volunteers have continued to work so that we can all stay connected to First Presbyterian Church of Paw Paw, Michigan.

During the COOVID-19 pandemic, church services and meetings in our building have been limited, but we still need to maintain our building, finish our west entrance and parking lot project do general maintenance, tweak our new sound and video system and reach out to all of you.

The Session met on August 18, 2020, in in-house, some on Zoom. This format takes patience and humor to accomplish our goals. Some new members have volunteered to serve on the Stewardship Commission: THANK YOU, Kathy McGuire, Mike Seymoure, Jerry Dundon, Tom Shoemaker and Andy Thorburn, we will do our best to make this an easy productive campaign.

PROPERTY IMPROVEMENT— UPDATES ON THE NEW WEST ENTRY WAY

Despite the pandemic, progress is continuing on the new west entrance. Thanks to the hard work of several volunteers, we have a new roof and doors on the garage, and will soon have new siding. Landscaping is also being worked on.

The next step will be to remove dirt and three feet off of the east side of the existing parking lot, then install the new storm retention tank. Then the gravel will be hauled in and compacted. This work could be completed in October at an estimated cost of \$11,000. Final paving could take place next spring, and is estimated at \$9,100.



Long Range Planning (LRP) members were very happy with that schedule because we would like to gravel to settle through winter. So where does that leave us?

Since this project began, the Property Improvement Fund (PIF) has received contributions from 40 households and organizations for over \$53,000 All but about \$1,000 was spent on completing Phase 1—the new entry. We need to again ask for about \$25,000 in contributions to cover the work mentioned above, finish the landscaping and prepare for a dedication and grand re-opening, which we hope could take place by next summer.

Upon recommendation of the Administration/ Finance Commission, Session has approved a request for funding to complete Phase II of this project as part of our 2021 Stewardship Campaign. Our General Fund takes priority as we need to be able to cover our expenses, but please consider what you can give to help us complete this project in 2021. Donations can be made any time—designate to "PIF-West Entrance."

Donations to the 2021 Capital fund will also be important, as Building and Grounds recently approved an estimate to replace some of our HV/AC units that are out of date and not working well. If this money is raised, it is anticipated that we could use the new west parking lot this winter.

The Prayer Study Group, which last met on March 9, 2020, has been postponed ever since due to the COVID-19 pandemic and hopes to start in 2021. The Formation Commission and class leaders continue to pray for the continued good health and safety for all our members, all healthcare workers, all essential workers, all educational workers as schools reopen, all our Church Staff, and all our governmental leaders as they continue to grapple with the weighty decisions that must be made in the face of the COVID -19 pandemic.

Sadly, the changes to our Church School format and suspension of our need for childcare on Sunday mornings resulted in the resignation of Meg Waddell from the position of Church School Coordinator. We wish Meg all the best and look forward to staying connected with her as a member of our church family.



HARDER THAN IT LOOKS!

Technology upgrades continue to take place in our sanctuary. When we first started recording our worship services, Pastor Tiffany was using her phone to record video and audio for worship services. The video portion was good but the audio needed some quality improvement. It was determined that to improve sound quality we needed to send the audio to the sound board and then out to the livestream. A new software application, a device called a "switcher" that mixes camera view with the worship slides have been added and now we are able to livestream our worship service.

Our Worship Technology Team—including students Keelin McCafferty, Logan McCafferty and Nathaniel McCloskey, along with Andy Thorburn and Tom Shoemaker—received training from Jerry Miller on the features of our much-improved system.


THANK YOU JERRY MILLER!
